FOR THE URGENT PERSONAL ATTENTION OF MUSA KUSA, DEPARTMENT OF INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS AND COLLABORATION

Following message for Musa in Tripoli from Mark in London

- I am so grateful to you for your help in sorting out this visit to the Leader by our Prime Minister. The diplomats had failed to get organised. What you did made a great impression at No 10. They are grateful too.
- A member of the Prime Minister's staff, David Quarrey, will be travelling to Libya shortly to discuss arrangements. He will be coming on diplomatic channels.
- No 10 have asked me to put to you their request that there be no publicity for the Prime Minister's visit now or over the next few days that is well in advance of the visit. Since Madrid everyone is extra security conscious.
- In No 10, their present thinking is that there should not (not) be a press confinence for the Leader and the Prime Minister. (After reading the British press in them weeks this seems to me only sensible. The Prime Minister will have 60 journalists with him). They are considering whether to propose that the Leader and the Prime Minister both make a short statement to the press. I think this will be followed up by the diplomats and maybe David Quarter.
- No 10 however are keen that the Prime Minister ment the Leader in his term. I don't know who the English are thecimored by terms. The plain face is that the journalists would love it. My coun ones is that it would give a good impression of the Leader's preference for simplicity which I know is important to farm. You may have some very different press coverage of the Frime Minister in Reyalls. Anyway if this is possible. No 10 would be very grantful.

I am so glad. I was grateful to you for helping the officer we sent out last week. Abu 'Abd Allah's information on the situation in this country is of urgent importance to us. Amusingly, we got a request from the Americans to channel requests for information from Abu 'Abd Allah through the Americans. I have no intention of doing any such thing. The intelligence about Abu 'Abd Allah was British. I know I did not pay for the air cargo. But I feel I have the right to deal with you direct on this and am very grateful to you for the help you are giving us.
